That portion of the garden situated towards Pausilippo, is distributed as an English shrubbery. This garden being a delightful retreat on summer evenings, is the general resort of the fashionable world; attended by sellers of eatables of all kinds, with lemonade, music, etc. the scene becomes uncommonly animated and interesting; and to all the various sounds of life and gaiety, the monotonous roar of the ocean at a short distance, offers a kind of bass. Besides this public garden, something of the kind may be seen upon the tops of a number of houses. The poorer sort content themselves with a few flower pots in the balconies before their windows; but though the taste for gardening is not so lively here as in Northern Europe, the terraces of persons in easy circumstances are generally furnished with large pots, which contain oranges and citrons, roses, Arabian jessamine, and other plants that do not require much humidity.
